Colorado state law requires students who attend public, private or parochial kindergarten - 12th grade school to be vaccinated against many of the diseases vaccines can prevent.

Parents/guardians will be given the K-12th Grade School Required Immunizations letter provided by the Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment at the beginning of the year parent teacher conferences.

Parents/guardians are required to provide Chávez/Huerta Preparatory Academy (CHPA) records office with a copy of their child's updated vaccine record every time their child receives a vaccine.

If a child cannot receive vaccines because of medical reasons, the parent/guardian must submit an official Immunization Medical Exemption Form to the CHPA Records Office. This form must be signed by a health care provider licensed to give vaccines.

If the parent/guardian chooses not to vaccinate their child because of religious or personal belief reasons, they must submit a non-medical exemption to the CHPA records department every school year.
